



What does LAS Links Online offer?



- Grades K-12
- LAS Links has 4 English Forms:
 - Form A
 - Form B
 - Form C
 - Form D
- 2 Español Forms:
 - Español Form A
 - Español Form B
- Each Form of LAS Links has 4 Subtests that are each sold separately:
 - Subtest 1 = Speaking
 - Subtest 2 = Listening
 - Subtest 3 = Reading
 - Subtest 4 = Writing

 - At the time of purchase, the customer does NOT need to indicate what form of the test they would like to use. Customers will have access to all forms and can use any/all of them at their discretion.
 - Refer to the "Quick Reference Guide" below to read about the details of each of the LAS Links Forms.
- All one-to-one testing time is eliminated!
 - Students go to the computer(s), put their headsets on, speak into the microphone on their headsets for speaking, click through for listening and reading, and type their answers for writing (and reading open ended items found on Form C/D and Español Form B)
 - Students from all different grade/test levels can take the test at one time in a computer lab
- Testers listen to, and read, the student responses to holistically score online
 - CTB offers scoring services for the Speaking, Writing and Reading open-ended responses at an additional cost
- Reports include immediate individual and group reports for quick identification and placement needs
 - Robust reports are also included to help identify student strengths and weaknesses and to inform instruction
 - Access to student results is available at any time, from anywhere that has internet access
 - Data can be exported to any data management system that accepts .csv files
- Student information (i.e. name, dob, id) can be bulk uploaded to LAS Links Online as well as individually loaded (depending on your needs)
